SCHEDULE 1: ROAD VERGES, RIGHTS OF WAY, SERVITUDES, ACCESS WAYS ANI **PARKING AREAS**

1. General:

To maintain and keep in a neat and tidy appearance all road verges, servitudes, right: of way, access ways and parking areas used by the general public as indicated by the Manager the site inspection.

All waste shall be disposed of at the Humberdale Landfill site at the prescribed tariff cos for the Contractor's account.

Road Verges

- Keep cut and trimmed throughout contract period to provide neat appearance, 1.1 not allowing more than 75mm growth at all.
- Width of verge to be cut shall be to the property boundaries from the edge of the 1.2 road on both sides.
- All grass tracks to be cut to a minimum overall width of 5 metres. 1.3 1.4
- Tar, kerbs and road edge to be kept free of grass creep and weeds.
- All bush and tree branches overhanging the road that fall below 4.3m from the 1.5 road surface must be removed.
- Verge area shall not be diminished by allowing bush or trees to expand without 1.6 1.7
- All litter, refuse, waste, cuttings and trimmings referred to in 1.1 to 1.5 above to be collected and disposed of at the Humberdale Landfill site at prescribed tariffs. 1.8
- Fallen trees, branches, etc., to be removed to refuse site. 1.9
- Remove and maintain free of all noxious and invasive vegetation.
- Remove any fallen trees and or tree branches from roads and verges within 12 hours of receiving an instruction from the Municipality to do so. 1.11
- All cuttings must be kept clear of stormwater drains, ditches and culverts.
- Special precautions to be taken not to mow too low. (Minimum of 1.12 20mm to remain).
- Ensure visibility of street name signs. 1.13
- Trimming of hedges along main access road to be carried 1.14

out at least every two months.

The contractor will be responsible for the pruning of trees on the verge that a 1.14 overhanging onto privately owned properties or driveways. The contractor will t responsible for the removal of trees that may be old or decaying or posing as risk or nuisance to any life or property.

The Municipality will supply the contractor with a maximum of 150 indigenor 1.15. trees which the contractor will be required to plant on the verges in accordance with the tree planting guidelines during the contract period. Compost to plant th trees shall be supplied by the Municipality.

The contractor shall be responsible for applying herbicide and removing all gras 1.16 creep on the verges, pavements and paved areas.

They shall be responsible for the weeding, cleaning, trimming and maintenanc of the flower beds and gardens along all road sides and traffic islands.

2 Right of Way Servitudes and Access Ways

- To be maintained in neat order, allowing free flow of pedestrian or vehicula 2.1 traffic to and fro, through the right of way.
- 2.2 All bush or trees to be kept from obstructing pedestrian movement and traffic site distances and movement.
- Remove and maintain free of all noxious and invasive vegetation and overgrowth 2.3
- Not to allow growth in excess of 75mm. 2.4
- Fallen trees, branches etc, to be removed to the Humberdale Landfill 2.5 site.
- Special precautions to be taken not to mow too low. (Minimum of 2.6 20mm to remain).
- The contractor will be responsible for the pruning of trees that are overhanging 2.7 onto privately owned properties or driveways. The contractor will be responsible for the removal of trees that may be old or decaying or posing as a risk or nuisance to any life or property.

3. Parking Areas

- Remove and maintain free of noxious and invasive vegetation and overgrowth, to 3.1 allow adequate use of facility.
- Collect and dispose of all litter and maintain in neat and tidy state. 3.2
- All lawned/ grassed areas on the beachfront as well as parking areas on the 3.3 beachfront to be cut as provided in 2.1 above.
- Fallen trees, branches etc. to be removed to the Humberdale Landfill 3.4 site.
- Special precautions to be taken not to mow too low. (Minimum of 3.5 20mm to remain).
- The contractor will be responsible for the pruning of trees that are overhanging 3.6 onto privately owned properties, parking areas or driveways. The contractor will be responsible for the removal of trees that may be old or decaying or posing as a risk or nuisance to any life or property.

SCHEDULE 2: PUBLIC OPEN SPACES, CARETAKERSHIP AND COUNCIL PROPERTIE!

1. General:

To initially clear and remove all noxious and invasive vegetation and overgrow followed by follow-up spray and or further clearing and removal to maintain control and eventually eliminate noxious and invasive vegetation. This cycle is to ensu regrowth does not exceed 200mm in height at any time during the contract perio Please note that all herbicide used to be approved by the department of Agriculture

All waste shall be disposed of at the Humberdale Landfill site at the prescribed tariff co: for the Contractor's account.

2. Public Open Spaces:

To cut and remove all noxious and invasive vegetation including excessive 2.1 overgrowth as an initial process and; 2.2

To remove any litter, debris and any other objects strewn on the site;

To be followed by a follow up spray program and/ or cut and removal program to 2.3 ensure regrowth does not exceed 300mm in height. 2.4

N.B. A program and method of intended work is to be submitted with the tender which is to include the name of the registered Herbicide Sprayer.

The contractor will be responsible for the pruning of trees that are overhanging 2.5 onto privately owned properties, walkways or driveways. The contractor will be responsible for the removal of trees that may be old or decaying or posing as a risk or nuisance to any life or property.

Remove any fallen trees and or tree branches 2.6

- 3. Caretakership: As per 2. above.
- Council Property/ Sports fields/ Libraries etc: As per 2. above. 4.

SCHEDULE 3: STORMWATER CHANNELS, STREAMS, RIVERS AND CULVERT

1. General:

To maintain, clear and remove debris from stormwater drains and culverts on all public streets and stormwater drainage servitudes as indicated by the Manager at the site inspection.

Streams and rivers must be kept free of all noxious and invasive vegetation. Litter and waste must be removed.

All waste shall be disposed off at the Humberdale Landfill site at the prescribed tariff cost for the Contractor's account.

2. Stormwater drains:

- All surface stormwater drains, kerb drains and street channels are to be clear 2.1 of silt and debris including vegetation to ensure unhindered flow of stormwater all times. Complete stripping to be avoided wherever possible to preve erosion.
- Grass creep and weed growth, bushes etc. are to be cleared, where necessa 2.2 to be sprayed
- Damage of any nature that may have occurred is to be reported immediately 2.3 the Manager in writing. 2.4
- All cleared debris and vegetation to be removed immediately after clearing to the Humberdale Landfill Site at prescribed tariffs. 2.5
- No silt/ debris to be left on sidewalks or street verges under any circumstances.

3. **Culverts:**

- 3.1 All culverts are to be cleared of debris including vegetation to ensure unhindere flow of stormwater and visibility of headwalls.
- Grass creep, weed, growth, bushes etc. to be cleared. 3.2
- Damage to culverts to be reported immediately to the Manager in writing. 3.3
- All cleared debris and vegetation are to be removed immediately from site afte 3.4 clearing to the Humberdale Landfill site.
- No silt/ debris to be left on sidewalks or street verges under any circumstances. 3.5

SCHEDULE 4 : TREE TRIMMING

1. Scope of work:

Tree branches overlanging onto the road must be trimmed to a height of 4.3 metres from the road surface.

Tree branches overhanging onto walkways to be trimmed in a manner to accommodate

The contractor shall be responsible for the removal of Invasive Alien Trees and the application of approved herbicides on the cut stumps

Trees close to street lights must be trimmed not to obscure the lights.

No vegetation should obscure any information / traffic signs

The contractor will be responsible for the pruning of trees that are overhanging onto privately owned properties or driveways. The contractor will be responsible for the removal of trees that may be old or decaying or posing as a risk or nuisance to any linear property.

When trees have been pruned they must be sealed with an approved sealer. (also refer to

Public Liability Insurance:

The successful tenderer shall have proof of R1 million Public Liability Insurance for t duration of the contract. The policy must be endorsed noting the interest of the Umdo Municipality. Any damages caused will preclude Umdoni Municipality from any claims.

Evidence of Insurance:

Proof of Insurance/ copy of the contract to be submitted to Umdoni Municipality within twenty-eight days of commencement of Contract.

Deduction for failure to submit Evidence of insurance:

If proof of insurance is not submitted in accordance with clause (7) above the Counc reserves the right to deduct 20% from each payment due until evidence of insurance i produced.

SUB-LETTING

The Contractor shall not sub-let any part of the Works without the prior written consent of the Council and such consent if given, shall not relieve the Contractor from any liability or obligation under the Contract and he shall be responsible for the act, defaults and neglects of any sub-contractor, his agents, servants or workmen as fully as if they were the acts, defaults or neglects of the Contractor, his agents, servants or workmen INSPECTION OF SITE

The Contractor shall inspect and examine the site and its surroundings and shall satisfy himself before submitting his tender as to the form and nature of the site, the quantities and nature of the work and materials necessary for carrying out the Works, the accommodation he may require and in general shall himself obtain all necessary information as to risks, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or affect his tender.

DISPUTES

If, at any time during the currency of the Contract, any question, dispute or difference, shall arise between the Manager and the Contractor, either party shall as soon as reasonably practicable give to the other notice, in writing, of the existence of such question, dispute or difference, specifying its nature and the point at issue.

Failing agreement upon such issue within 14 days following the giving of notice as aforesaid, the matter shall be referred for mediation to a person mutually agreed by the parties to the Contract and the decision of the mediator shall be final and binding on the parties hereto.

The existence of a dispute or difference between the Manager and the Contractor shall not absolve the Contractor in any manner or to any extent from carrying out the work

having being obtained or shall have an execution levied on his goods or wherever the Manager has certified in writing that the Contractor:

- (a) has not exercised or is not exercising due diligence in the execution of the Worl of this Contract; or
- (b) has not executed or is not executing the work in accordance with the Contract,

the Council may, by notice in writing to the Contractor, terminate this Contract forthwitl provided that the exercise of this right by the Council shall not in any way whatsoever affect the obligations, liability and responsibility of the Contractor or any party other that the Council, or his liability to pay damages to any person, including the Council, arisin out of his default.

CONTROL OF INVASIVE ALIEN VEGETATION

In accordance with the Conservation of Agriculture Resources Act No.43 of 1983, a declared rategory 1 and 2 weeds and invader species listed in Regulation 15 of 200 that occur on the verges, access ways, parking areas and open spaces must be eradicated. The contractor will be responsible for treating all Invasive alien species with approved herbicide by well trained staff. The Contractor will be responsible for developing and implementing an Alien Eradication Plan (AEP) for the relevant maintenance area.

General Conditions of Contract

- 1. Definitions
- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.

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- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the goods are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or neglige ance and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

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- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid sub mission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the goods covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price, which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the

supply of the goods, such as transportation and an y other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

- 1.25 "Supplier" means the successful bidder who is awarcled the contract to maintain and administer the required and sepecified service(s) to the State.
- 1.26 "Tort" means in breach of contract.
- 1.27 "Turnkey" means a procurement process where one service provider assumes total responsibility for all aspects of the project and delivers the full end product / service required by the contract.
- 1.28 "Written" or "in writing" means hand-written in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services (excluding professional services related to the building and construction industry), sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific goods, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a nonrefundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and on the municipality/municipal entity website.

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information inspection

5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shalf

- extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentationed in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent Rights

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 6.2 When a supplier developed documentation / projects for the municipality / municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership of such documents or projects will vest in the municipality / municipal entity.

7. Performance security

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque.
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that goods to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage be subject to inspections, tests and analyses, the bidder or contractor's premises shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the goods to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and a nalyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the goods or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such goods or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Goods and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract goods may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to compty with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected goods shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with goods, which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected goods shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute goods forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected goods, purchase such goods as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 22 of GCC.

9. Packing

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size

weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.
- 10. Delivery and documents
- 10.1 Delivery of the goods and arrangements for shipping and clearance obligations, shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract.
- 11. Insurance
- 11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.
- 12. Transportation
- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.
- 13. Incidental Services
- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:
 - performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods:
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
 - (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.
- 14. Spare parts 14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract;
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Variation orders

18.1 In cases where the estimated value of the envisaged changes in purchase does not vary more than 15% of the total value of the original contract, the contractor may be instructed to deliver the goods or render the services as such. In cases of measurable quantities, the contractor may be approached to reduce the unit price, and such offers may be accepted provided that there is no escalation in price.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20 **Subcontracts**

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

supplier's performance

- 21. Delays in the 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
 - 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
 - 21.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the goods are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

- 21.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 22.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a goods contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase goods of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) If the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgement of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner, as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

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- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be all lowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) clays the purchaser may regard the supplier as having no objection and proceed with the restriction.
- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the purchaser will, at the discretion of the purchaser, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the purchaser actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser:
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website

24. Antidumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervalling duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dunned or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the supplier to the purchaser or the purchaser may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the supplier in regard to goods or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

Disputes

- 27. Settlement of 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
 - 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree;
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier for goods delivered and / or services rendered according to the prescripts of the contract.

28. Limitation of Liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
 - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

31. Notices

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid SARS must have certified that the tax matters of the preferred bidder are in order.
- 32.4 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose nounicipal rates and taxes and municipal services charges are in arrears.

33. Transfer of contracts

33.1 The contractor shall not abandon, transfer, cede assign or sublet a contract or part thereof without the written permission of the purchaser

34. Amendment of contracts

No agreement to amend or vary a contract or order or the 34.1 conditions, stipulations or provisions thereof shall be valid and of any force unless such agreement to amend or vary is entered into in writing and signed by the contracting parties. Any waiver of the requirement that the agreement to amend or vary shall be in writing, shall also be in writing.

restrictive practices

- 35. Prohibition of 35.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder(s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding.
 - 35.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s) based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998.
 - 35.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s) has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.
